#### Understanding the Effects of the "Jenga-Tower" of Grief

Commission to Every Nation (CTEN) has orientation four times a year for all new mis-sionaries to our agen-cy. I have the privi-lege of teaching a session during orienta-tion on grief pro-cessing. The mission-ary life is FULL of

ary life is FULL of losses and grief, espe-cially hidden ones. I often think we do not realize the hardships that can come with living overseas. I teach our missionaries that our grief is like a block on a Jenga tower. Every grief inducing event becomes a block that stacks up on the tower higher and higher until something eventual-ly causes it to topple over. We give them tools to help process the blocks on their tower be-cause when they process the block it then re-moves it from the tower. This then allows that block to no longer stand as a threat of helping toppling the tower over. During my presentation I have our missionaries right down any grief induc-ing events they have experienced on the field (if they are already serving) or think they will face (if they are already serving) or think they will face once they are on the field. I thought I'd share a picture with you of the blocks from this past

#### Berlin House Church God Story: Caught in the Embrace of Jesus

artment. Unable to get to the phone, she said Jesus comforted her until help came. After being treated at the hospital, she was diagnosed with cancer. From then on, Mary was in the hospital. Sh was often in and out of the ICU. She

Multiple times the doctors said Multiple times the doctors said that she wasn't going to make it. But again and again, they were proven wrong. In the midst of her physical struggle, Mary said that Jesus freed her from her depres-sion. Despite not being able to get out of a hospital bed, Mary was filled with ear much iar. filled with so much joy, laughter, and hope

Unfortunately, Mary continued to grow sicker. After 5 months of battling cancer in the Hospital, Mary left to be with the Lord. This

was extremely difficult for Tonya, who remained by her mother's side the entire time, praying with her and hoping for a miracle. For a

small and tight church family, it is very difficult to lose someone so close to us. But we are thankful for the time that we did have with Mary, and what a wonderful ray of light she was in our church.

In a lot of ways, Mary was like the prodigal son. Who lost sight of the love of her father, but never forgot where her home truly was. It is beautiful to think of her pace hock to losus and hoirag

Guabal IBAC Institute that FEFC is Supporting:

- Guabal will be on the Caribbean side of Panama ۵
- ۵ 100 pastors/leaders (some evangelists/foreign church-planters)
- Closer to unreached Ngobe zones Unreached people are a two-day's walk into jungle

Please pray that God will continue to open doors and put in the hearts of our church leaders to become part of the Ngobe teaching cadre for the next 7 years.
